Subject Grant of conditional permission to Maharashtra Arogya Mandals, Sumatibhai Shah Ayurved Mahavidyalaya, Sr No 165 A, Malwadi, Hadapsar Pune – 411028, Maharashtra (Inst. ID. AYU0148) with 54 seats (instead of 60 seats) in UG (BAMS) course and 78 seats in 13 PG courses in the subject namely –(i) Ayurveda Samhita and siddhant-06 seats (ii) Kriya Sharir-06 seats (iii) Rasa Shastra and Bhaisajya Kalpana-06 seats (iv) Dravyaguna vigyana-06 seats (v) Rog Nidan avum Vikriti Vigyan-06 seats (vi) Agad Tantra avum Vidhi Vaidyaka-06 seats (vii) Swasthavritta-06 seats (viii) Prasuti and Stri Roga-06 seats (ix) Kaumarbhritya-06 seats (x) Kayachiktsa-06 seats (xi) Shalya Tantra-06 seats (xii) Shalakya Tantra-06 seats and (xiii) Panchakarma- 06 seats and 05 seats in 01 PG Diploma Course in the subject namely Prasuti Evum Striroga for the academic session 2024-2025, under section 28 of NCISM Act, 2020 for the academic year 2024-25.

Sir/Madam,

With reference to the subject mentioned above, I am directed to inform you that in pursuance of the provision of National commission for Indian System of Medicine Act, 2020, the Indian Medicine Central Council Act,1970 (48 of 1970) has been repealed with effect from the 11th day of June, 2021. With effect from the said date, the Central Council of Indian Medicine constituted under sub-division (1) of section 3 of the Indian Medicine Central Council Act, 1970 (48 of 1970) shall stand dissolved. Now, in exercise of the powers conferred by subsection (3) of the section 1 of the said Act, the Central Government hereby notifies that all the provisions of the National Commission for Indian System of Medicine Act, 2020 has been come into force with effect from the 11th day of June, 2021.

- 1. Further, to assess the available facilities of teaching, non-teaching, hospital staff, practical training and other infrastructure facilities at your college namely Maharashtra Arogya Mandals, Sumatibhai Shah Ayurved Mahavidyalaya, Sr No 165 A, Malwadi, Hadapsar Pune 411028, Maharashtra (Inst. ID. AYU0148), inspection of your College was conducted on 22.02.2024 & 23.02.2024 on Hybrid mode as a part of annual visitation by the visitation team of Medical Assessment and Rating Board, NCISM to process the conditional permission with 60 seats in UG (BAMS) course and 78 seats in 13 PG courses in the subject namely (i) Ayurveda Samhita and siddhant-06 seats (ii) Kriya Sharir-06 seats (iii) Rasa Shastra and Bhaisajya Kalpana-06 seats (iv) Dravyaguna vigyana-06 seats (v) Rog Nidan avum Vikriti Vigyan-06 seats (vi) Agad Tantra avum Vidhi Vaidyaka- 06 seats (vii) Swasthavritta- 06 seats (viii) Prasuti and Stri Roga-06 seats (ix) Kaumarbhritya-06 seats (x) Kayachiktsa-06 seats (xi) Shalya Tantra-06 seats (xii) Shalakya Tantra-06 seats and (xiii) Panchakarma- 06 seats and 05 seats in 01 PG Diploma Course in the subject namely Prasuti Evum Striroga for the academic session 2024-25, under section 28 of NCISM Act, 2020 and relevant regulations thereunder.
- 2. Further, in view of above, the visitation report and all other related documents were assessed in terms of enforced regulation namely, the "Indian Medicine Central Council (Requirements of Minimum Standard for under-graduate Ayurveda Colleges and attached Hospitals) Regulations, 2016", "Indian Medicine Central Council (Post-graduate Ayurveda Education) Regulations, 2016" and provisions under the NCISM Act, 2020 and relevant Regulations there under. On examining the case in light of above notified and approved criteria and on perusal of the visitation report, it was observed that the college was not fulfilling the basic eligibility criteria due to following shortcomings:-

Functionality of the hospital –

Average Bed occupancy is 44.04% and there is shortcoming of 5.95%.

- 3. In view of above, the assessment report was placed in the 93rd Board meeting of Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine (NCISM) on 13.06.2024 & 14.06.2024. Board discussed and decided to ask for clarification in the aforementioned shortcomings and same was communicated to the college vide letter of ref.no.3-3/MARB/2024-Ay (9) even dated 10.06.2024.
- 4. In response of the same, college submitted the clarification vide ref. no. MAM/ SSAyu/ 96 dated 13.06.2024. In view of above, the assessment report along with the clarification report was placed in the 99th Board meeting of Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine (NCISM) on 26.07.2024.
- 5. Thereafter, the clarification submitted by the college & the assessment report have been carefully examined in terms of concerned Regulation and provisions under the NCISM Act, 2020 and relevant regulations thereunder, and it is found that the college is not fulfilling the basic eligibility criteria for grant of conditional permission with 60 seats in UG (BAMS) course and 78 seats in 13 PG courses in the subject namely –(i) Ayurveda Samhita and siddhant-06 seats (ii) Kriya Sharir-06 seats (iii) Rasa Shastra and Bhaisajya Kalpana-06 seats (iv) Dravyaguna vigyana-06 seats (v) Rog Nidan avum Vikriti Vigyan-06 seats (vi) Agad Tantra avum Vidhi Vaidyaka- 06 seats (vii) Swasthavritta- 06 seats (viii) Prasuti and Stri Roga- 06 seats (ix) Kaumarbhritya-06 seats (x) Kayachiktsa-06 seats (xi) Shalya Tantra-06 seats (xii) Shalakya Tantra-06 seats and (xiii) Panchakarma- 06 seats and 05 seats in 01 PG Diploma Course in the subject namely Prasuti Evum Striroga for the academic session 2024-25, under section 28 of NCISM Act, 2020 and relevant regulations thereunder. However, Board decided to issue conditional permission as per the approved Seat Reduction Policy in accordance of Section 28 (1) (f) of NCISM Act 2020 for failing to maintain the minimum essential standards for the Academic year 2024-25.

As per the seat reduction policy:-

a) "For every one percent deficiency in Bed occupancy, seat reduction in the intake capacity shall be considered by reducing the intake strength by one seat."

The Availability of Average bed occupancy percentage after considering the submissions made by the college is 44.04% with a short-coming of 5.95% which is rounded off to 6%. Therefore, in accordance of seat reduction policy 2024-25, seat reduction in the intake capacity shall be considered by reducing 06 seats of the total intake capacity.

- 6. Accordingly, after applying the seat reduction policy 2024-25 under section 28 (1) (f) of NCISM Act 2020, college is fulfilling the basic eligibility criteria for issuance of Conditional permission with 54 seats [instead of 60 seats] in UG (BAMS) course and 78 seats in 13 PG courses in the subject namely -(i) Ayurveda Samhita and siddhant-06 seats (ii) Kriya Sharir-06 seats (iii) Rasa Shastra and Bhaisajya Kalpana-06 seats (iv) Dravyaguna vigyana-06 seats (v) Rog Nidan avum Vikriti Vigyan-06 seats (vi) Agad Tantra avum Vidhi Vaidyaka- 06 seats (vii) Swasthavritta- 06 seats (viii) Prasuti and Stri Roga- 06 seats (ix) Kaumarbhritya-06 seats (x) Kayachiktsa-06 seats (xi) Shalya Tantra-06 seats (xii) Shalakya Tantra-06 seats and (xiii) Panchakarma- 06 seats and 05 seats in 01 PG Diploma Course in the subject namely Prasuti Evum Striroga, under section 29 of the NCISM Act, 2020 for the academic session 2024-25.
- 7. Therefore, in view of shortcomings and deficiencies mentioned as above, conditional permission is issued to the Maharashtra Arogya Mandals, Sumatibhai Shah Ayurved Mahavidyalaya, Sr No 165 A, Malwadi, Hadapsar Pune 411028, Maharashtra (Inst. ID. AYU0148) for issuance of conditional permission with 54 seats (instead of 60 seats) in UG (BAMS) course and 78 seats in 13 PG courses in the subject namely –(i) Ayurveda Samhita and siddhant-06 seats (ii) Kriya Sharir-06 seats (iii) Rasa Shastra and Bhaisajya Kalpana-06 seats (iv) Dravyaguna vigyana-06 seats (v) Rog Nidan avum Vikriti Vigyan-06 seats (vi) Agad Tantra avum Vidhi Vaidyaka- 06 seats (vii) Swasthavritta- 06 seats (viii) Prasuti and Stri Roga- 06 seats (ix) Kaumarbhritya-06 seats (x) Kayachiktsa-06 seats (xi) Shalya Tantra-06 seats (xii) Shalakya Tantra-06 seats and (xiii) Panchakarma- 06 seats and 05 seats in 01 PG Diploma Course in the subject namely Prasuti Evum Striroga for the academic session 2024-2025, under section 28 of NCISM Act, 2020 for the academic year 2024-25.
 - (i) The college shall submit an undertaking in the form of affidavit duly notarized within one month explaining the details of providing EPF and ESI facilities to the teaching, non-teaching staff of the Colleges/Hospitals and regularly paying the same as per the provisions of Employees' Provident Funds and Miscellaneous Provisions Act, 1952 & ESI Act, 1948 and relevant Rules and Regulations.
 - (ii) It is further informed that minimum 15% of undergraduate seats of the permitted intake capacity with 54 seats (Instead of 60 seats) and 15% of postgraduate seats of the permitted intake capacity in 78 seats in 13 PG courses shall be treated as all India quota. The counseling for seats under all India quota shall be conducted by respective counseling authority as designated by Central Government for A.Y. 2024-25 and counseling for the remaining 85% seats or as the case may be, shall be conducted by the concerned Counseling Authority of that State/UT. The permission of the college stands withdrawn if the college fails to comply with the aforesaid direction of the Central Government/NCISM for all India quota or the students admitted thereunder.
 - (iii) It is also informed that determination of fee and all other charges in respect of 50% of seats in private Medical Institutions and deemed to be University should be as per the guidelines issued by NCISM vide ref no. BUSS/Fee/ASU/2022-23 dated 16.09.2022. Fees of the remaining 50% of seats are to be fixed as per the guidelines of Fee Fixation/Regulatary Committee (FRC) of respective State/UT/Deemed to be University.

- Admissions made in violation of the above conditions will be treated as invalid and action will be initiated under NCISM Act & Regulations thereunder.
- 9. Further, as per Sub-section (7) of Section 29 of NCISM Act, 2020, The Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine may conduct evaluation and assessment of any University or medical institution at any time, either directly or through any other expert, having integrity and experience in medical profession, without any prior notice and assess and evaluate the performance, standards and benchmarks of such University or medical institution and if the college is found to be not maintaining the Minimum Essential standards as specified in the concerned Acts & Regulations then in accordance of Section 28 (1) (f) of NCISM Act, 2020 the issued permission of the college shall deemed to be withdrawn and denial of permission shall be issued by MARBISM for stoppage of admission for that particular academic year or the subsequent year.
- 10. Discrepancies, if any, may be immediately brought to the notice of Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine, NCISM.
- 11. The following requirements should be fulfilled by the college by 31st December, 2024 and send a compliance report to get permission for the academic session 2025-2026:
- i. All the requirements under the provisions of the NCISM Act, 2020 and relevant Regulations made thereunder should be fulfilled in toto.
- ii. All the requirements of Minimum Standard of infrastructure and teaching & training facilities as specified in NCISM (Minimum essential standards, assessment and rating for undergraduate Ayurveda colleges and attached teaching hospitals) Regulations, 2024.
- iii. All the requirements of the National Commission for Indian System of Medicine (Minimum Standards of Undergraduate Ayurveda Education) Regulations, 2022.
- All the requirements of the Indian Medicine Central Council (Post Graduate Ayurveda Education) Regulations, 2016.
- v. The shortcoming mentioned in point no 2.
- 12. The fulfillment of the conditions given above may be made within the time period specified and compliance report should be submitted by the college to President, Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine. The Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine will verify that the conditions have been fulfilled for considering the permission for the academic session 2025-26.
- 13. Further, the conditional permission letter to Maharashtra Arogya Mandals, Sumatibhai Shah Ayurved Mahavidyalaya, Sr No 165 A, Malwadi, Hadapsar Pune 411028, Maharashtra (Inst. ID. AYU0148) dated 12.08.2024 shall be null and void.
